Joel Hellman, Class of '67 and his cousin, Carol Hellman Dragon, Class of '65, were talking about Mather and how they could help the students. They both agreed on the importance of nurturing and developing the talent that percolates in the multi-cultural and urban population, one which is clearly represented at Mather.

Unbeknownst to her, Joel started a fund in honor of his cousin, to reach such students. Although totally embarrassed by his insistence that her name be used for the fund, she was not at all embarrassed by its purpose and mission.

"The Carol Hellman Dragon Friends of Mather Fund" will offer any certified Mather personnel who works with students, the opportunity to request money (up to \$ 400) for an innovative student program or an opportunity for supplemental student learning "above and beyond" what CPS can offer. Perhaps the art or music teachers want to create a classroom project that requires special materials. Perhaps a student advances in the History Fair, but needs funds to travel to Springfield for the day, or perhaps several students need registration fees for a unique science opportunity. There are many ESL (English as a Second Language) students at Mather who may not excel academically due to the language barrier, but who demonstrate talents in math or art and may need the help of this fund for supplies or workshop fees. These are the magic moments in education, when adolescents begin to see possibilities for their futures.

We are calling this grant "The Spark Grant" and we ask that the major intention be to ignite the excitement and love of learning in these students. We believe that talent and academic energy need to be nurtured and developed, and that lack of access to minimal financial resources should not be a barrier. The evaluation committee is comprised of alumni who currently teach or previously worked in Chicago Public Schools.




Juliana Basko-Pluska, MD Mather Graduate 2000
